**RESOLUTION TO OVERRIDE THE MAYOR’S VETO OF ORDINANCE
(B-278) “ORDINANCE UPDATING CHAPTER 141: MUNICIPAL
PARKING GARAGE RATES FOR RESIDENTS TO ADD A SECTION
PERMITTING BICYCLE PARKING”**

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2020 the City Council of the City of Hoboken introduced Ordinance B-278, entitled ““ORDINANCE UPDATING CHAPTER 141: MUNICIPAL PARKING GARAGE RATES FOR RESIDENTS TO ADD A SECTION PERMITTING BICYCLE PARKING” ;” and,

WHEREAS, upon introduction, said Ordinance was properly published in its entirety and a public hearing was conducted on July 8, 2020 after which Ordinance B- 278 was adopted by the City Council by a vote of 7 yeas, 2 nays; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance B-278 was then sent to the Mayor for his consideration; and,

WHEREAS, on Friday, July 17, 2020, Mayor Ravi S. Bhalla issued a veto of Ordinance B-278 and issued a veto statement setting forth his objections thereto; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:69A-41, the City Council may reconsider the vetoed Ordinance on or after the third day following its return by the Mayor, providing a vote of two-thirds of the members resolve to override the Mayor’s veto; and,.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Hoboken (at least two-thirds of the members concurring) that the City Council has reconsidered Ordinance B-278 and confirms the passage of said Ordinance, hereby overriding the Mayor’s veto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk and all other applicable City officials shall take all necessary action to ensure that the intent and purposes of Ordinance B-278 are effectuated to their full extent; and,

**ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 190 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC
TO AMEND PARKING REGULATIONS AND TRAFFIC CIRCULATION
ON SINATRA DRIVE BETWEEN NEWARK STREET AND 4TH STREET**

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the Secretary of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency under section 319 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 247d) in response to the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19); and,

WHEREAS, since then, State of Emergencies were declared by the President of the United States, the New Jersey Governor and Hoboken's Office of Emergency Management and stay-at-home orders were issued at the State and local levels; and,

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has also had a devastating impact on the United States economy, including local businesses within Hoboken; and,

WHEREAS, on May 2, 2020, Governor Murphy rescinded the statewide stay-at-home order, and initiated "Stage 2" of New Jersey's Reopening Plan, which authorized a restart of moderate risk activities such as outdoor dining and non-essential retail stores for indoor shopping; additionally Governor Murphy strongly encouraged people to practice social distancing, wear masks and choose outdoor activities over indoor activities; and,

WHEREAS, on May 20, 2020, Hoboken City Council adopted an ordinance permitting local dining establishments to expand their sidewalk cafes and build parklets or "StrEATERIES" along the curbside of streets to expand their outdoor dining capacity and provide safe outdoor dining opportunities; and,

WHEREAS, due to major outbreaks of COVID-19 occurring in at least 16 states, Governor Murphy issued a follow up Executive Order on June 29, 2020 that postponed reopening of indoor dining in New Jersey indefinitely; and,

WHEREAS, Hoboken's waterfront remains an attraction to Hoboken residents and visitors alike, and with the Stage 2 opening the City is seeing a significant increase of traffic, crowds and congestion along the waterfront, in particular along Sinatra Drive south of fifth street; and

WHEREAS, the City Council and the Administration are recommending a plan for Sinatra Drive between Newark and Fourth Street with the goal of supporting local businesses, increasing parking spaces and at the same time helping to relieve congestion around the southern Waterfront area and therefore addressing the related public health, safety and nuisance issues; and

WHEREAS, in the first instance, relocating on-street parking from the east side to the west side of Sinatra Drive between First Street and Fourth Street to make it possible for adjacent restaurants to expand their outdoor dining space along the curbside in the form of parklets or StrEATERIES; and,

WHEREAS, relocating on-street parking from the east side to the west side of Sinatra Drive between First Street and Fourth Street will also result in a net gain of approximately five parking spaces; and,

WHEREAS, the travel lane shall be relocated to the east side of Sinatra Drive; and,

WHEREAS, to promote safe, outdoor activities during the summer such as walking and bicycling, the City Council is proposing to close Sinatra Drive between Newark and Fourth Street through Labor Day 2020 (September 7th, 2020) limiting vehicle access only to public safety and commercial vehicles; and

WHEREAS, additionally, to help further reduce congestion and traffic on weekends, which typically have the largest crowds, for Saturdays and Sundays through October 11th, 2020, vehicle access will be limited to public safety only; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council and Administration will continue to consider other measures in parallel to relieve congestion around the Waterfront area, promote social distancing, and enhance pedestrian safety.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Hoboken does hereby Ordain as follows (additions noted in underline, ~~deletions noted in strikethrough~~):

SECTION ONE: AMENDMENTS TO HOBOKEN CODE CHAPTER 190

§ 190-4. Parking prohibited certain hours.

D. No person shall park, stop, or stand a vehicle at any time along the ~~entire~~ east side of Sinatra Drive between Fourth Street and Eleventh Street (except that stopping is permitted in accordance with state and local Motor Vehicle laws) including to pick-up or drop off passengers, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m., from the effective date of this ordinance section until the end of the State of Emergency for COVID-19, as determined by the Hoboken Office of Emergency Management, or September 30, 2020, whichever is sooner.

§ 190-6. No stopping or standing.

B. Stopping or standing prohibited at any time. In accordance with the provisions of this subsection, no person shall stop or stand a vehicle at any time upon any of the following described streets or parts of streets:

§ 190-29.8. Time limit parking locations and fees.

B. Stopping or standing prohibited at any time. In accordance with the provisions of this subsection, no person shall stop or stand a vehicle at any time upon any of the following described streets or parts of streets:

§ 190-26.1. Temporary Closures of Sinatra Drive

- A. Except for what is provided in paragraph B below, from the date of the enactment of this ordinance, through September 7th, 2020, Sinatra Drive from and including the intersection with Newark St. to the southerly curblineline of Fourth Street will be closed to all vehicular traffic except for public safety and commercial vehicles in accordance with N.J.S.A. 39:4-137(b).
- B. From the date of the enactment of this ordinance, through October 11th, 2020, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 39:4-8(c)(6) on each Saturday and Sunday, Sinatra Drive from and including the intersection with Newark St. to the southerly curblineline of Fourth Street, will be closed to all vehicular traffic except for public safety vehicles, subject to the approval of the New Jersey Department of Transportation, as necessary.
- C. Commercial vehicles requesting access during such times listed in B, are subject to approval in advance by Hoboken Police Department or the Department of Transportation and Parking.
- D. The Director of Transportation and Parking may make such reasonable regulations as necessary to effectuate the intent and purpose of this section.

SECTION TWO: REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, it being the legislative intent that all such ordinances or part of ordinances now existing or in effect unless the same are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance shall remain in effect.

SECTION THREE: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable and if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance, but shall remaining in

effect; it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

SECTION FOUR: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION FIVE: CODIFICATION

This ordinance shall be a part of the Code of the City of Hoboken as though codified and fully set forth therein. The City Clerk shall have this ordinance codified and incorporated in the official copies of the Code.

The City Clerk and the Corporation Counsel are authorized and directed to change any Chapter, Article and/or Section number of the Code of the City of Hoboken in the event that the codification of this Ordinance reveals that there is a conflict between the numbers and the existing Code, and in order to avoid confusion and possible accidental repealers of existing provisions not intended to be repealed.
